The wise men set off and there in front of them was the star they had seen rising ... it stopped over the place where the child was. The star filled them with delight and there they found the child with his mother Mary.



I have included a template to support your planning. It is one we have used in school so hopefully you will be familiar with it.







Maths Today we are going to work on our understanding of place value by looking at the value of digits in three digit numbers.

We can partition 3 digit numbers into hundreds, tens and ones



We can show this in words

7 hundreds



8 tens

2 ones

We can also write this as an addition

$$700 + 80 + 2 = 782$$

We can also represent the number by drawing.




When we are drawing 3 digit numbers at school, we use squares, lines and dots. You can use these in the task below too.

Did you know that we can make an adjective by adding the suffix -ful to lots of root words?

thank + ful = thankful

It means someone is full of thanks.

Look what happens to the word 'full' when it becomes a suffix:

full becomes -ful when it is a suffix.

We can add the suffix -ful to a root word to make an adjective:

cheer + ful makes the word cheerful.

wonder wonderful

joy joyful

peace peaceful

We don't have to swap, double or drop any letters when we add the suffix -ful. Here is the rule:

If a suffix starts with a consonant letter (-ful), it is usually just added straight on to a root word. No changes are made to the root word.

Let me give you a little tip about the word 'beauty' though. We have to swap the y to i when adding the suffix -ful.



Where Is Antarctica?



Antarctica is a continent (a large solid area of land). It is the furthest south in the world. It is surrounded by the Southern Ocean. Antarctica is about 50 times the size of the UK.

Antarctic Animals

Lots of different animals live in Antarctica. They have all developed special features to help them to survive in very cold temperatures.

Emperor penguins are the largest penguins in the world. Emperor penguins have special fat layers in their feet to keep them from freezing. They also have strong claws to help them grip the ice.



Fur seals have thick fur to protect them from the cold. They also have a thick layer of fat, called blubber, under their skin to keep them warm.

Orcas have a large heart which helps to pump lots of warm blood around their body. They also have a thick layer of blubber under their skin to keep them warm.



What Is It Like in Antarctica?

Antarctica is the coldest place on Earth and almost the whole continent is always covered in ice. Because of the extremely cold temperatures, no people live in Antarctica permanently. There are also parts where no rain ever falls.
