### Find a balance

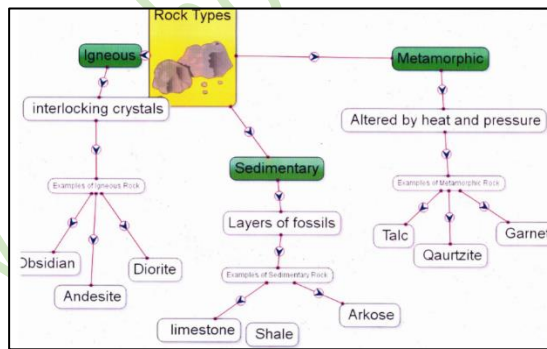
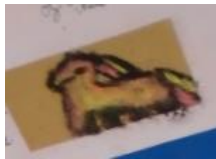
It's important to make sure you have a balance of online and offline learning, so try to do a little of both throughout your learning time at home. Don't forget those movement breaks too!
