The outdoor education programmes offered by the Trust are designed to promote health and well-being while nurturing a sense of curiosity and fascination with the natural world. I am delighted to announce that St Mary's has been selected to participate in the Early Language Support for Every Child (ELSEC) programme. This two-year pathfinder initiative, funded by the Department for Education and NHS England, aims to implement innovative workforce models to improve outcomes for children with speech, language, and communication needs (SLCN) in early years and primary education. We extend our gratitude to Mrs Lambie for her successful application, which has secured our place among a select group of schools to benefit from this additional support.

Looking ahead, our Year 5 pupils are eagerly anticipating their upcoming visit to Cadbury World. This excursion promises to bring their curriculum to life through a tailored educational talk presented by dedicated specialists. The programme will introduce our pupils to the great city of Chichen Itza and its most famous landmarks, delving into Maya theories of creation and other fascinating myths and legends. Pupils will have

the opportunity to examine real cacao pods, inhale the aroma of cocoa beans - once highly prized by the Maya circa AD 900 - and observe the traditional wooden whisk used in the preparation of their favoured chocolate beverage. Select pupils will even have the chance to don traditional Maya attire. The visit will explore various aspects of Maya culture, including their sporting activities, religious beliefs, and artistic achievements, drawing connections and contrasts with our contemporary lives.

Lastly, I would like to express my sincere gratitude for your continued partnership in ensuring good attendance for your children. The success of our school is a collaborative effort, with parents, carers, pupils, and staff all playing crucial roles. We firmly believe that every child has the right to access the education to which they are entitled, and it is our shared responsibility to support and promote excellent school attendance and punctuality.
