I am pleased to share with you the recent developments in our reception and Year One classes. All children in these year groups have undergone comprehensive speech and language screening assessments, providing valuable insights into their linguistic capabilities. The most proficient children demonstrated an impressive ability to name various animals and objects, employ descriptive language, complete sentences, and elucidate simple procedures. Their capacity to utilise the word 'because' and follow basic instructions was particularly noteworthy. However, it became evident that some children encountered difficulties with certain activities, exhibiting limited vocabulary and word comprehension. To address this, we strongly encourage parents to engage in activities that promote language development. Creating word family lists, such as those for animals or foods, can be immensely beneficial. Additionally, posing questions about stories can significantly enhance comprehension skills. It is crucial to resist the temptation of allowing older siblings or parents to answer on behalf of our youngest learners. Instead, we must foster an environment that encourages active participation in conversations. By promoting talking, listening, asking, and answering, we can collectively support the linguistic growth of our children. Your partnership in this endeavour is invaluable, and we appreciate your continued support in nurturing our children's communication skills.

Parking

Year 2 Kingswood Trip

I am delighted to report on the resounding success of our Year 2 excursion to Kingswood. This educational venture provided our children with a multitude of enriching experiences, each designed to enhance their understanding of the natural world and foster essential skills. The Habitat Tracks Trail, a key component of the trip,



afforded the children the opportunity to explore and describe the habitats of woodland animals. Utilising maps and clues, they engaged in a practical application of their geographical and observational skills, reinforcing classroom learning in a tangible, real-world context. The children's enthusiasm was palpable as they navigated the Kingswood grounds using compasses, an activity that not only honed their orienteering abilities but also instilled a sense of adventure and discovery. The diverse environments they encountered, including woodlands, ponds, and open fields, served as living laboratories, bringing their studies of ecosystems and biodiversity to life. The low ropes adventure areas and climbing wall presented our Year 2 children with physical challenges that demanded both individual perseverance and collective problem-solving. It was heartening to observe their collaborative efforts as they navigated these obstacles, demonstrating the invaluable life skills of teamwork and resilience. Perhaps one of the most captivating activities was the pond dipping session. The children's faces were alight with wonder as they discovered an array of aquatic life, including newts and various other fascinating species. Armed with

magnifying glasses and identification cards, they embarked on a journey of scientific inquiry, meticulously observing and cataloguing their findings. This hands-on experience not only augmented their biological knowledge but also kindled a spark of curiosity that we hope will flourish into a lifelong appreciation for the natural sciences. The culmination of the trip saw our children engaging in a creative cartography exercise. Working collaboratively, they crafted maps using natural objects to represent the key features and landmarks of Kingswood. This activity seamlessly integrated geographical skills with artistic expression, encouraging the children to view their environment through a new lens and translate their observations into tangible representations.

Lockdown



Transitioning to matters of school security, I am pleased to inform you that our staff have recently undergone training in a new approach to lockdown procedures. We have taken a thoughtful, age-appropriate approach to

introducing this concept to our children, utilising the metaphor of an angry dog to contextualise the importance of safety measures. In the coming week, we will be conducting a full practice drill to reinforce these procedures. It is crucial that all parents and carers are aware of the protocol should a lockdown be initiated while you are on school grounds. If staff members call out 'Lockdown', you must immediately enter the nearest exit. If directed, proceed to the hall; otherwise, enter the nearest classroom and adhere to staff instructions. Your compliance with these measures is paramount to ensuring the safety of all individuals on our premises.

Wraparound Care




