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

What is Advent?

Advent is a very special time for Catholics and Christians all over the world. It's the four weeks before Christmas when we get ready to celebrate the birth of Jesus, our Savior. The word "Advent" means "coming," and during this time, we prepare our hearts and minds for the coming of Jesus.

Here's what Advent is all about:

1. A Time of Waiting and Preparation

Advent is like waiting for a very special guest! Just as we might clean our house and decorate for visitors, we prepare our hearts for Jesus. We do this by praying, being kind to others, and thinking about how we can be more like Him.

2. The Advent Wreath

In church and at home, you might see an Advent wreath. It has four candles: three purple and one pink.

- Lighting one candle each week helps us count down the days until Christmas.

3. Thinking About Jesus' Birth

During Advent, we remember how the world waited for Jesus a long time ago. God promised to send a Savior, and when Jesus was born in Bethlehem, that promise was fulfilled.

4. Looking Forward to His Return

Advent isn't just about the past; it's also about the future. We believe that Jesus will come again, so Advent is a time to think about being ready for Him when that happens.

5. Acts of Love and Kindness
