


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## St Mary's Catholic Primary School Newsletter

## **Important Reminder: Changes to Homework**

After reviewing educational research, gathering feedback from families, and reflecting on how children learn best, we have decided to stop setting formal written homework across the school.

Our aim is to ensure that home learning is meaningful, manageable, and joyful. We recognise that every family has different routines and pressures, and we hope this change supports a calmer, more balanced home life—something we value deeply as a Catholic community.

Children will still be expected to complete the following each week:

- Phonics practice
- Reading at least five times per week
- Learning weekly spellings
- Practising number bonds
- Practising multiplication tables

**The Importance of Reading at Home** Reading remains one of the most powerful ways to support your child's learning and nurture their imagination. Just a few minutes each day can strengthen vocabulary, build confidence, and open their hearts and minds to new ideas.

Thank you for the time, love, and encouragement you give your children at home. It truly makes a difference.

### **Curriculum Information**

To help you stay informed, we will continue to outline key learning and topics for each term in our curriculum newsletter. This will give families a clear understanding of what is being taught and how you may support learning at home if you wish.

While there is no requirement to complete extra homework, children are welcome to:

- Create their own project
- Carry out additional research
- Visit a place of interest (museum, library, local landmark, etc.) related to their learning

These optional activities allow pupils to follow their interests and deepen their understanding in ways that suit your family.
